1

Citizen
Involvement



Calls for public participation in the planning process from the local level on up

2

Land Use
Planning



Outlines the basic procedures of the program, including comprehensive plans

3

Agricultural
Lands



Defines agricultural lands; requires county inventories and zoning-based protection

4

Forest
Lands



Defines forest lands; requires county inventories and policy- or ordinance-based protection

5

Scenic, Historic,
& Natural Resources



Establishes inventory process and provides local policy choices for 12+ natural & cultural resources

6

Air, Water, & Land
Resources Quality



Aligns local comp plans and implementation with state and federal environmental regulations

7

Natural Hazards
& Disasters



Requires appropriate safeguards when planning and developing in natural-disaster-prone areas

8

Recreation
Needs



Calls for community evaluation of recreational resources and planning for projected demand

9

Economy
of the State



Calls for diversification/improvement of economy and community planning for future zoning needs

10

Housing



Requires cities to inventory buildable lands and plan for/accommodate needed housing types

11

Public Facilities
& Services



Calls for efficient planning of public services like sewers, water, law enforcement & fire protection

12

Transportation



Aims to provide a safe, convenient, inclusive & economic transportation system

13

Energy



Calls for maximized energy conservation as part of land use and development

14

Urbanization



Establishes the requirement and mechanics of Urban Growth Boundaries for all towns & cities

15

Willamette
Greenway



Protects the Willamette River with 300 miles of greenway; includes administrative procedures

16

Estuarine
Resources



Requires classification of Oregon's major estuaries and outlines permitted uses for each category

17

Coastal
Shorelands



Establishes management for land along the coast from the beaches to Highway 101

18

Beaches
and Dunes



Sets planning standards and prohibitions for development on beaches & various types of dunes

19

Ocean
Resources



Aims to conserve the long-term quality and value of Oregon's nearshore ocean waters
